... afterwards decided to be w<sup>ar</sup> in ~~North Carolina~~ and he was raised there and continued to live in that County till after the close of the Revolutionary War - He moved into Pecken, District about thirty two years ago, and has resided on the same plantation where he settled, or coming from the State of North Carolina.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the Army of any State.

And the said Court do hereby declare their opinion after the investigation of the matter, and after putting the interrogatories prescribed by the war department that the above named applicant was a revolutionary soldier and served as he states. And the Court further certifies that it appears to them that John Jobb

 On this eleventh day of March 1833 -  
 personally appeared in open Court before  
 the Honorable Justice J. Evans in the Court of General  
 Sessions & Common Pleas of this said State Justice District  
 of Beaufort now sitting Jeffrey Beck a resident of the  
 District of Beaufort and State of South Carolina, aged upwards  
 of Eighty one years, who being first duly sworn accord-  
 ing to Law, doth on his oath make the following declara-  
 tion, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Con-  
 gress passed June 7. 1832. That he entered the service  
 of the United States under the following named officers  
 and served as herein stated - That he turned out under  
 Captain John Scotlin, of Col. Dugans Regt of the North  
 Carolina Militia, He was sent out on a scout with one  
 Isaac M. Daniels who was first Sergeant of the Company  
 He was engaged principally in the County he lived in  
 Randolph he was sometimes in Chatham County &c.  
 he served a tour of nine months and was discharged by  
 John Scotlin the Capt with 10. June 1779 - He was after  
 called into service as a Volunteer in Capt John Hunt's  
 Company of Cavalry he served three months as Ranger  
 and was discharged on the 30. December 1780 he was  
 engaged in several Counties in S.C. adjoining Randolph  
 where he lived, taking prisoners and keeping down the  
 Tories - He was one of the first men called on to  
 go to the South against the Tories & Cherokee Indians,  
 he was unwilling to go he hired Enoch Davis  
 to go in his place, and paid him twenty five dollars  
 He took the oath of Allegiance on the 12. Sept. 1778  
 He lived on the main road and was liable to be much  
 harassed; his Capt John Hunt gave him a Certificate  
 to protect his property while he was out or even at home  
 against oppression by the friends of the United States -  
 This declarant has no documentary evidence or receipt  
 such as discharge & Certificate, as are herein mentioned  
 and that he knows of no person whose testimony he can  
 procure to testify to his service - This declarant  
 was born in Augusta County Virginia, he  
 has understood, his Father moved into Orange  
 County in the State of North Carolina - which

who has signed the preceding certificate is a Clay County  
 Resident in the District of Pickens, and that Joseph  
 Green who has also signed the same is a resident  
 in the same District, and is a credible person and  
 that their statement is entitled to credit.
