{ Act 18th March, 1818. }

On this Twenty seventh day of November, 1820, Court of Common Pleas, November Term 1820. being a Court of Record for said state, John Campbell 1820, personally appeared in open Court years, resident in Muskingum county in said state, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth of his oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary War on the continental establishment, as follows: In the 4th Regiment, commanded by Col. John White Company Georgia Line. The date of my original application is 10, 20th of May 1818 and the number of my pension certificate is 10, 204.

And I do solemnly swear, I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th of March 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March 1818. And that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than that which is contained in the schedule herunto annexed, and by me subscribed.

My occupation is farming; owing to debility of body's Rheumatism. Not able to pursue it. The number of my family residing with me is two.

De Haven, that before me in the state of Ohio and county aforesaid personally appeared John Campbell and made oath, that he is a resident citizen of the said state and county, that he served as a private soldier in the Revolutionary war against Great Britain, that he enlisted on or about the 1st of May 1777 for and during the war, in Captain _____ fourth Regiment, Virginia line, on the establishment _____ that he was discharged at Georgia, by a private discharge signed by _____ on or about the 1st of November 1781. That he has no other evidence that he is now in his 56th year of his age, and in consequence of his reduced circumstances, is unable to appear in person in support of his claim to this 1st of May 1818.
