he served in an expedition at Four Holes, Seventy two
days, and under General Henderson, and Forty six
days, as Lieutenant of Horse, in an expedition at Water-
ford Congaree, making in all about Six Months and
Eight days, and that he was at the Siege of Ninety
Six, and at Orangeburgh, Four Holes, also at Water-
ford, and Congaree, and that he was in the Battle at
Rocky Mount, and that he served at Cloyd old field.
He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a Pen-
sion or annuity, except the present; and he declares
that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any A-
gency in any State.
And he furthermore by these presents irrevocably con-
stitutes, appoints and fully empowers William R. Perry
and Henry H. Walker, of Stock Hill Georgia his true
and lawful Attorneys for him and in his name and
